

Brush Waste Guidelines

Accepted Items:

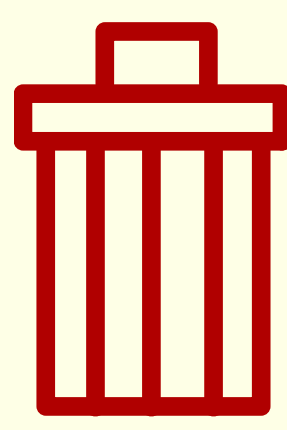
- Grass clippings (preferably in clear bags)
- Leaves
- Brush (must be cut into 4-foot lengths)
- Tree limbs (less than 4 inches in diameter)
- Christmas trees (remove all ornaments and lights)
- Organic material produced in your yard or garden

Unacceptable Items:

- Food waste
- Treated wood

Brush Collection Rules:

- Place all items curbside by 7:00 a.m. on Wednesdays during your collection week.
- Limit of 4 cubic yards per collection.
- Grass clippings and leaves must be bagged and tied (compostable bags are recommended).
- Brush and tree limbs should not exceed 4 feet in length or weigh more than 50 pounds per bag or bundle.
- Green waste must be set at least 4 feet away from other objects and should not be placed in your city-issued trash cart.



Bulk Waste Guidelines:

Accepted Items:

- Bicycles and large toys
- Carpet and padding (must be cut into smaller sections, no more than 50 pounds)
- Furniture
- Lawn tools – example: lawn mowers (gas and oil removed)
- Mattresses and box springs
- Stoves, washers, dryers, water heaters, and microwaves (no refrigerators, freezers, or AC units)
- Wood or fence (cut into sections no larger than 6' x 4' x 4')
- Brush not exceeding 6 feet in length

Unacceptable Items:

- Construction materials (e.g., bricks, concrete, gravel, soil, sod or dirt)
- Hazardous materials (e.g., chemicals, paints, fuels, compressed gas)
- Automotive parts or electronics
- Glass panes, glass doors, or mirrors
- Household trash that fits into a trash cart (additional carts are available upon request).
- Buildings, building attachments, or sheds

Bulk Item Placement Rules:

- Do not place items in the street, on sidewalks, or in a way that interferes with traffic or waste collection.
- Keep items at least 5 feet away from trash carts, mailboxes, fences, water meters, or utility poles.
- Avoid placing items under low-hanging tree limbs or power lines or in alleys or vacant lots.
